



## Arabic Youth Worker

The Arabic Youth Worker works within a high-energy, creative, collaborative team to provide a variety of social, recreational and skill development activities to newcomer youth. The position will include facilitating group workshops, organizing community out-trips, 1:1 youth support, and community outreach to address youth settlement needs. **This is a part time, eight month contract position with possibility of extension.**

Hours: Approximately 15 hours/week

Starting Salary: \$22.20/hour

Start Date: August 2017

Contract: Until March 31, 2018 with possibility of extension

### Duties and Responsibilities:

- Create and implement a plan to provide support to vulnerable Arabic speaking youth
- Create and implement a plan for community outreach and promotion
- Communicate with local teachers, counselors and administrators as necessary to maintain to ensure we are meeting the needs of local newcomer youth
- Provide social, recreational, and skill development activities for local newcomer youth
- Provide 1-1 settlement support to youth as required
- Provide a physically and emotionally safe environment for all program participants, staff and volunteers
- Support newcomer youth to integrate with established youth in our community; including introducing newcomer youth to the various services, community centres, etc.
- Ensure programming fits within approved budgets
- Attend team meetings with settlement staff

### Qualifications:

- Ability to communicate effectively in Arabic
- Post-secondary degree in child and youth care, social work, or related degree
- Minimum 2 years' experience working with newcomer youth
- Demonstrated skills in outreach, program planning, implementation and evaluation
- Broad knowledge of community resources available for newcomers, and working relationships with other service providers
- Ability to communicate inter-culturally and comfortable working in a fast-paced multi-cultural setting
- Current First Aid and CPR certification or willingness to obtain
- Class 5 and/or Class 4 driver's license or willingness to obtain is an asset
