Peer Mentor – Youth Skills (2 positions available)

The **Peer Mentor** supports the Youth Skills Coordinator and Youth Programmer to plan, implement, and evaluate the Youth Skills Development Program. The position works out Frog Hollow Neighbourhood House, in addition to some virtual work and work in the community.

Youth Skills is a program specifically for BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour) youth ages 15-30 exploring topics and skills related to community care through a decolonial lens. Youth Skills staff help build community within each cohort by leading discussions and workshops as well as supporting participants in finding volunteering opportunities. We strongly encourage applications from Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour (BIPOC), individuals with disabilities, and members of the LGBTQIA2S+ communities.

Position:	Peer Mentor – Youth Skills Development Program
Hours:	Approximately 15 hours per week (min of 10 and max of 20 based on applicant's interest and availability)
Wage:	ANHBC Band 7 - \$20.27 - \$23.97/hour
Contract Date:	October 2021 – March 2022

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Support the Coordinator to oversee daily operations of the Youth Skills Program
- Provide a physically and emotionally safe environment for all youth participants, staff and volunteers
- Mediate, counsel, and act as a role model for participants/volunteers
- Provide support to youth in the program, both 1-1 and group based
- Co-facilitate training workshops and share input for curriculum
- Promote and connect with community and service agencies to recruit BIPOC youth and to find participants volunteer opportunities
- Other duties as assigned by the Program Coordinator

Qualifications:

- Experience working with BIPOC youth
- Extensive knowledge of the barriers BIPOC youth face
- A strong understanding of reconciliation and decolonization
- Demonstrated skills in youth support and outreach
- Broad knowledge of community resources available for youth, and proven ability to liaise and build relationships with service providers and community members
