The Community Programmer position is funded by Canada Summer Jobs program. The position will work alongside staff from the Family, Seniors, Food Security & Newcomers Program Team to provide a wide range of summer programming in the Hastings-Sunrise community of East Vancouver.

Position: Community Programmer

Hours: 35 hours per week over 8 weeks: July 18 to September 9th, 2022

Salary: \$22.90 per hour (Band P4 Step 1)
Closing Date: Open until the position is filled

To be eligible for Canada Summer Jobs program, applicants must be:

- be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* for the duration of the employment; and,
- have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Assist with operations of all programs within the Family, Seniors, Food Security & Newcomers Program
 Team
- Assist with the planning & implementation of community events, particularly, <u>Frogs in the Park</u>, our annual summer outdoor program
- Assist with supporting volunteers and outreaching to new community members
- Lead the design of communication materials such as poster design and digital curriculum modules **Qualifications:** The successful candidate will possess the following skills:
 - Demonstrated interest in a career in social services, alignment with the missions of the Neighbourhood Houses, and a passion for community food producing gardens, food sovereignty and food justice issues
 - Advanced knowledge in navigating the virtual world (i.e., emails, social media, video calls, installing apps, surfing the internet, online security, etc.)
 - Experience volunteering and/or coordinating volunteers is preferred
 - Training and experience in social marketing and event planning is an asset
 - Demonstrated ability to communicate inter-culturally & experience working with the diverse community
 - Proficiency in a second language is an asset
 - Current First Aid, CPR, and/or Food Safe certification is an asset
