Marpole Neighbourhood House (MNH) is a community-based organization which focuses on connecting people and strengthening the neighbourhood of Marpole. We are seeking a Seniors Community Programmer to lead the Seniors program at MNH. If you are passionate about building strong communities and making a difference in people's lives, we encourage you to apply for this rewarding role.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Planning and leading activities for older adults 55+ based on their needs and interests.
- Establish positive professional relationships with participants, and community partners.
- Attending community meetings and events as needed.
- Collect and analyze data to assess needs and seek resources for participants.
- Strong administrative abilities to handle various tasks efficiently.
- Perform work-related duties including answering phone calls, greeting community members and setting up and putting away program supplies and equipment.

Skills and Qualifications:

- Education in social services, gerontology, community support or related fields is an asset.
- Relevant experience working with older adults in a culturally diverse and inclusive setting.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills.
- Experience working with Newcomers to Canada and vulnerable, marginalized populations.
- Broad knowledge of resources and services for people living in the Marpole community.
- Excellent problem-solving and conflict resolution skills.
- Clear criminal record check upon hire required.
- First Aid and Food Safe certified are assets

Employment Terms:

This position is part-time (8-14hrs/week) every Monday, Wednesday and Fridays with hours ranging between 9:00am – 3:00pm with some possible evenings and weekends as needed.

Compensation: Pay rate is \$23.59 – \$26.14 per hour depending on skills and experience level.
