The successful candidate will have excellent guiding and caring skills and the ability to work in a diverse, multicultural, and energetic environment.

About the Position

Using a team approach Childcare Educator- Support Worker is responsible for overseeing the full integration of children with extra support needs into daycare program. This includes working together with the child, their family, and the staff team to attain goals determined in the Support Guide. Other responsibilities include the provision of quality care for all children in the program. Other responsibilities include developing strong relationships and communication with children, families and colleagues, implementing high standards of care and supervision that promote the wellbeing of all children..
